Another year has passed, and we open our report by speaking with Xavier Brines, the Principal of our college, and to Francisco Álamo Zamorano, our headmaster. We talk to them about some of the milestones achieved by Salesians Sarrià, as well as the values underpinning the way the college operates.

In a world in which many paths are closing, the Salesian colleges have committed to quite the opposite. 'Opening up paths' is this year's slogan. Where does choosing the Salesians Sarrià path lead?

The young people who come to our college are at a crossroads in their lives. In a short period of time they will be asked to make decisions about their vocational option that will affect their later academic and professional choices. The challenge that we face is to help them to make these decisions in the best way possible, without losing sight of each young person's uniqueness and processes.

The Salesians is the benchmark semiprivate VET centre in Barcelona. What does this mean for the college?

Historically, the Salesians have been the benchmark in the vocational and educational training of young people the world over. More specifically in Barcelona, we have engaged in vocational and educational training for many young people for 139 years. It is our area of expertise; we are education specialists. Being a benchmark college means constantly reviewing your own educational practice in an attempt to

respond to a three-fold demand: firstly, the students and their families, then the business fabric and the social setting. We do not undertake untested experiments or innovations in things educational: we stride forward self-confidently, in the knowledge that we work with people and with building their personal and occupational futures. We always strive to ensure that what we do is done well.

Your college was recently acknowledged by the Barcelona City Council for its promotion of Dual VET, which you apply to all your VET programmes. What are the strengths of this model, particularly in terms of job placement?

Job placement in vocational education and training continues to be extremely high. In many training programmes, the demand for employees that we receive from companies is far greater than the number of students who are actually ready to take up employment. Dual

VET constitutes a very significant step forward: it brings the students into direct contact with the labour market, albeit in a protected environment, namely the college, which accompanies them and is ultimately responsible for this process. For companies, it is a privileged space for discovering new talent for their workforces. The index of satisfaction is extremely high for both parties.

You promote a feeling of community through, for example, Christian values. How important do you feel that this is in the current environment?

In today's environment in which young people are choosing and opening up new paths, they have to deal with far-reaching questions about the meaning of their lives. This is our first main educational task: to get people to recognise and ponder the big questions. Subsequently, rather than promoting, it is more about proposing, based on our conviction that what we do propose is worthwhile, because it gives meaning to the life of many people: the person and the message of Jesus of Nazareth. Like any offer, part of any young person's growing up process consists of freely deciding whether this is the answer that they want to give to

these questions about the meaning of their life. We are convinced that here is where we can make a major contribution to society and, more particularly, to the world of education.

Sustainability is another key value in your model. Beyond the way in which it colours the education of your students, what impact does it have on the way that decisions are made at the college and how it is run?

The college has been working on the issue of sustainability for some time now, more than a decade: it is not just another value that needs to be included in an educational campaign. The college must be a sustainable and environmentally-friendly institution in its daily operations. This is our choice, and it is the foundation of our educational approaches: among other things, we have a sustainability plan; we apply environmental options when we select our suppliers; we proposed a green space that won the Green Roofs competition of Barcelona; we are members of the main local and international educational networks that target sustainability; and we also have teams that reflect upon this topic and review our practices.

You promote cultural exchanges through different international relations programmes in which you not only send students abroad, but also host students from other countries. What contribution would you say is made by the visiting students? For example, do they bring new educational insights?

Our college's internationalisation line and its European vocation are both clearly rooted in education and culture. We aim

to prepare our young people for a world in which the word 'globalisation' should begin to take on positive connotations: multilingualism, cultural exchanges, mobility and adaptation capacities, opening up new horizons for personal and professional growth, learning to look at life from different perspectives. We should not fear difference, because – when it is underpinned by dialogue and respect – it will always enrich us. Work experience abroad, exchanges, job shadowing, language learning and qualifications, participation in international projects with other colleges, and solidarity projects that also have an international scope, such as Share in Zambia. This is a reality that already exists in our college and it is one that we intend to cultivate even more.

Last January and February you hosted a student in his final year at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) specialising in Computer & Data Science who gave classes to the International Baccalaureate students. How would you rate this experience?

We are proud to have been chosen for the first time ever as the college to host a student from MIT. It was the first year that we took part in this initiative and its multiplicative effects on our college have been surprising. For the students and faculty, it heralds an important step forward in our embracing of new methodologies and ways in which IT is taught. We will definitely apply to participate in projects like this one again.

And from Barcelona to Silicon Valley. This academic year, your college won, for the second time, the EduCaixa Challenge featuring a project by two students also from the International Baccalaureate. What did this milestone mean for the college?

The Salesian college has a steadfast belief in young people and in their possibilities. Young people always

rise to the occasion when we give them motivating challenges and their response amply surpasses what is expected of them. All that is needed are educators who know how to guide these processes. Winning this award for the second year, and sending students from our college to Silicon Valley, speaks very eloquently of the professionalism and the enthusiasm of the teachers at the college who prepare these projects.

You recently started up an Alumni service for former students. What does it consist of and what do you hope to accomplish with it?

When a student enters a Salesian college, a bond is created with that person, one that goes far beyond the time they study with us. From the beginning, alumni are an essential part of our colleges' social harmony and equilibrium: the Salesian college delivers people with a specific imprint to its immediate surroundings. Staying in touch, taking advantage of synergies and creating collaborative networks are all issues fostered by our Alumni service.

What is the added value of the School?

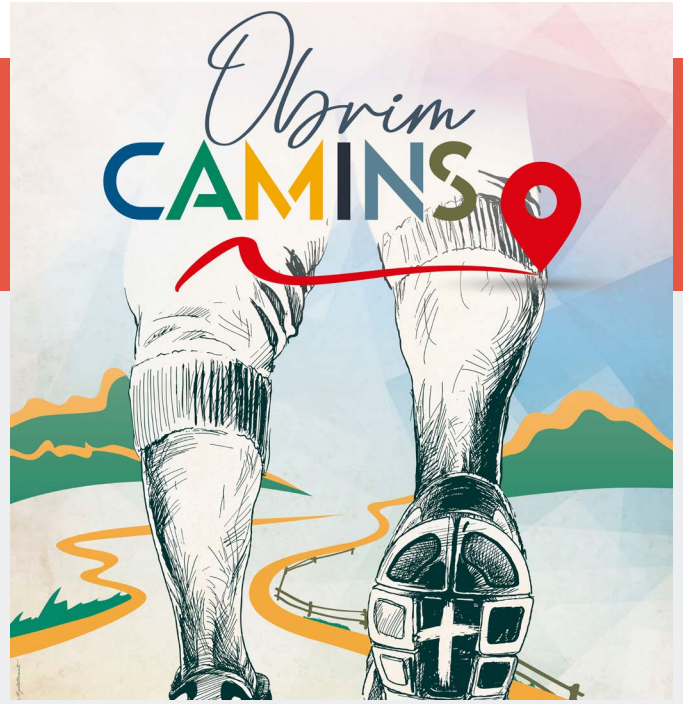

Salesians Sarrià specialises in post-compulsory education for young people, and we offer courses in Intermediate and Advanced VET, Baccalaureate and International Baccalaureate, as well as training and placement programmes (PFI). We open up paths to grow as people, to get to know ourselves better and to maximise our qualities in order to serve others.

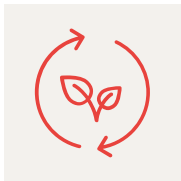
We open up paths towards others, fostering moments of spending time together, sharing and support, because we can only grow if we look beyond ourselves.

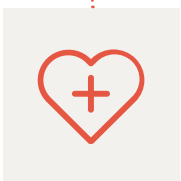
Sustainability, Health and Solidarity

The cornerstones of the college of today



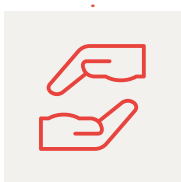
Sustainability

The ongoing climate crisis reminds us that embracing a sustainable lifestyle is not an option, but instead a need, if we are to take care of our planet. Salesians Sarrià, convinced that young people will play a key role in the necessary change of model, promotes habits such as energy-saving, love and respect for nature and other living creatures, recycling, and proper waste management. And we do so through different activities that are integrated into college life, such as the projects developed by our students and awareness-raising talks.



Health

Prioritising mental and physical health in a college is crucial to the well-being of the students and to guaranteeing good academic advancement. On the one hand, we promote physical activity, healthy eating habits and a safe environment. On the other, we work on mental health in the knowledge that it is directly related to emotional well-being and cognitive functioning and, consequently, to academic performance. Based on this conviction, Salesians Sarrià is part of the 'Fem salut' [Let's Be Healthy] programme of the Barcelona Public Health Agency and also runs an Educational Psychology Service (SAPP) for students. We also organise activities that encourage healthy habits such as 'Setmana de la Salut' [Health Week], and also foster interpersonal skills such as cooperation.



Solidarity

Schools must work on solidarity to generate a positive and integrating learning environment in which important social and emotional skills – such as empathy, respect and kindness – can be nurtured. This is a key Christian virtue in the Salesian model that we promote through different activities that we organise for the entire educational community, such as the annual Bosco Run, charity bake sales and different volunteer projects, including 'Share'.

College Solidarity

Salesians Sarrià promotes solidarity among its students in the conviction that fostering a strong sense of community and mutual support is crucial in creating a positive and integrating learning environment, not to mention a more cohesive and healthy society. It is also an awareness-raising tool for young people about the local and global problems that surround them.



'Repassem Junts' (Let's Revise Together)

One of the activities that we use to foster solidarity is the 'Repassem Junts' project, through which our volunteer students from Baccalaureate can help young children from the neighbourhood with specific needs. Local children can therefore study and do their homework at the college, while also enjoying a healthy afternoon snack and some play time.

The initiative received the UNESCO 'Fem Cultura amb els colors' award.

Bosco Global and Fundació Magone

Our college contributes with different volunteer activities and solidarity projects, such as the **Bosco Global** Salesian NGO, with which we seek to promote a fairer, more equal and sustainable world through actions in different African and South American countries. Another entity is the **Fundació Magone**, promoted by the Salesians of the Maria Auxiliadora Inspectorate and which, operating all over Catalonia, implements projects targeting the most vulnerable people in our society.



Charity run: THE BOSCO RUN

The Bosco Run for charity is one of the most popular activities organised by Salesians Sarrià in collaboration with **Salesianes Santa Dorotea**. Besides promoting sport among the students and an active and healthy lifestyle, it also encourages solidarity, and the proceeds are allocated to funding other college-sponsored projects such as 'Repassem Junts' (Let's Revise Together).

International volunteer project 'Share'

In collaboration with the English Salesians Farnborough College and The Daughters of Mary Help of Christians of Zambia, we offer this international volunteer project in which every summer students and teachers from the college travel to this African country to participate in different initiatives intended to help children and young people from Zambia.



More than half of the population of Zambia lives below the poverty line. During their volunteer work in this country in Southern Africa, the students glean first-hand experience of this reality, thus increasing their awareness of inequality in the world while also witnessing the struggle and the hope of societies, such as Zambia, that seek to progress and overcome the consequences of climate change, which takes the form of severe droughts there.

Solidarity 'scholarships' for young Zambians

True to our college's supportive spirit, students from different classes collaborate in the volunteer project by making donations that are allocated to scholarships for underprivileged young people from the town of Mazabuka, located in southern Zambia, with a population of more than 50,000 inhabitants, where unfortunately many of the young are forced to drop out of school.

Thanks to the solidarity of our students, whose numbers keep increasing, the young people who receive these scholarships can keep up their primary and secondary school studies and even go to university. We named this initiative the 'Scholarship Programme', and it is a fine example of the values that guide all Salesian colleges.

One good example of this is **Loveness**, a young girl whom we have helped to study nursing and has now graduated. This year she sent us photographs of her graduation, along with words of gratitude that inspire us to continue to work on this project.



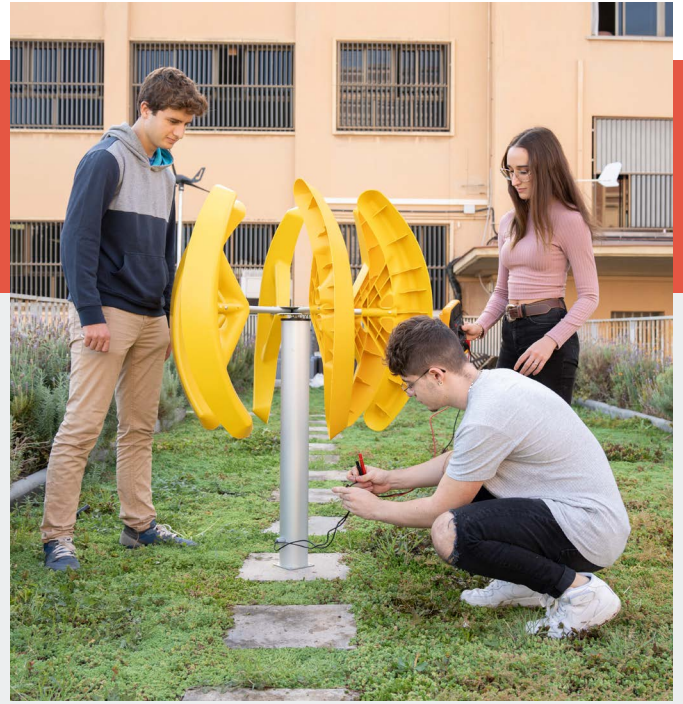

Well into the 21st century, education is still not guaranteed, and not just in Zambia. This is why we sponsor initiatives such as 'Share', to do our bit and align our college with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Sustainability, a Salesian core value

Sustainability is a cornerstone of Salesians Sarrià's educational model, which is revealed through different initiatives that take place during the academic year. Year after year, the number of projects run by students centred on this topic increases. We shall share some of the most noteworthy ones below.



The Don Bosco 'Green' alliance

Salesians Sarrià is part of the **'Don Bosco Green Alliance'** international initiative, an exciting project through which our students get involved in caring for the environment with the aim of creating a new generation of citizens and leaders with a deep environmental commitment.

A 'green lung' in the college

The college's 'Green Roof' project, which was started up four years ago as part of the Green Roof project of the Barcelona City Council, is a space that is used to train our Advanced level VET students in Renewable Energies, since it has photovoltaic solar panels and two wind turbines and also houses our weather station. Besides delivering multiple benefits associated with such an infrastructure: thermal and acoustic insulation, the collection of rainwater and capture of particulate pollution, to name just a few.

ICTA agreement

For the last two academic years, our college has had a collaboration agreement with the Institute of Environmental Science and Technology (ICTA) to guarantee knowledge transfer and to implement joint actions.

Sustainable mobility

Our college is committed to a more sustainable city. This is why we plan to use photovoltaic panels to install a vehicle-charging point so that anyone connected to the college can plug their electric vehicle into it. A space for parking bicycles and e-scooters has also been set up in the schoolyard.

UNESCO environmental endorsement

Salesians Sarrià is one of the 10,000 plus schools from more than 180 countries that have been recognised by the **United Nations Education, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO)** as an Associated Schools Network. Besides sustainability, we foster peace, internationalisation, health and solidarity. Values that have earned our college recognition as a UNESCO Associated Schools Network.

Sustainable waste management

Minimising the generation of waste, as well as its sustainable management after it is produced, are essentials of the circular economy on which we actively work in the college. For example, we introduced new drinking water fountains to reduce the use of single-use plastics.

A city with more trees

In addition to Green Roof, Salesians Sarrià has planted several trees in the schoolyard over the course of recent years, an action which also has an impact beyond our own facilities in contributing to capture particulate pollution, thereby improving air quality in Barcelona. Furthermore, the trees help to create a more pleasant space for the educational community and for any other living creatures that may be passing through.

Examples of sustainable projects

The culture of sustainability is an all-encompassing part of the college's approach to life, so much so that our students are deeply committed to caring for the environment and to creating projects and research based on sustainability, some of which are explained below.



Ministerial projects

The college is working on three projects that were accepted for the latest call for 'Projects for innovation and applied research and knowledge transfer in vocational educational training' of the Ministry of Education and Vocational Training. All these projects, funded by the Ministry, involve different professional profiles and strengthen innovation and teamwork:

- **CyberGreen Lab:** this project was implemented by VET students from our college in collaboration with Salesians Palma del Río and the companies Nechi-Group and Amaysys Technologies. It generates renewable energy from the photosynthesis process of plants attached to a green wall. This project comprises different Industry 4.0 facilitating technologies, such as artificial intelligence, 3D printing and cybersecurity, and is also aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals.
- **'Technical profile in 3D healthcare Units: the binomial of diagnostic imaging and mechanical manufacturing, future hybridisation in VET'**, with the Institut Bonanova d'FP Sanitaria (Barcelona), the Instituto Inmakulada (Tolosa) and the Cotes Baixes secondary school (Alcoi), with the participation of the Hospital de Sant Joan de Déu of Barcelona.
- **'Application of immersive technologies in welding in key educational processes: attaching-learning orientation'**, with the Cotes Baixes, Tirant lo Blanc and Escola del Treball secondary schools, with the participation of Augmented Training, a company specialising in virtual learning.

A new life for soft drink cans

With the objective of extending the service life of waste and reducing its environmental cost, a group of students from the Advanced level VET in Mechanics have developed a machine that compacts, shreds, and melts soft drink cans. It is yet another step in a project that began last year, with the design and construction of a can compactor, which will enjoy continuity with the melting of recycled material to create ingots. These ingots will be used to build aluminium objects that will be sold to fund social projects. A fine example of the circular economy and sustainability.



Going to school more sustainably

Switch & Green Mobility is 'sustainable parking' for electric scooters that was designed by two Intermediate VET students for parking and recharging scooters, using electricity generated by photovoltaic panels and a wind turbine, which employ solar and wind energy, respectively. This helps to promote sustainable mobility to and from the college. This project merited the Don Bosco 2021 Award for the best Research Project in Engineering and the Premi Impuls FP 2022 award, with first place for the best viability.

International relations

We live in a country that is fully integrated into the European Community and into a globalised economy, where exchanges of all kinds are constant. The professionals of the future must also be part of this global dynamic, which is why we have an extensive offer of international activities and programmes.



Salesians Sarrià fosters the internationalisation of our educational community by promoting foreign language skills and projects such as ERASMUS+. We are a quality European college and a place for exchange, not only of knowledge, but also of values and cultures. We are a paradigm of a globalised country.

Exchanges with Germany, the United Kingdom and Denmark

Hallo, Deutschland! Hi, UK! Hej, Danmark! We have agreements with colleges from Germany, the United Kingdom and Denmark that allow our students to enjoy a cultural experience abroad, as well as in their own homes, where they host international students who come to Spain. It is therefore an exchange carried out in two college periods and is a well-established part of our annual schedule.

Small conversation groups

Learning a language is not just about the time spent in weekly classes, as continuity outside the classroom is essential. In our college, more specifically, this is done at lunchtime, which is when the students can get together in small groups with mainly native speakers to engage in two types of language courses: conversation classes (English, French and German) and courses to prepare them for the official First Certificate and Advanced examinations.

ERASMUS+

Initiated by the European Commission to promote student exchanges in the European Union, the ERASMUS+ programme gives VET students the chance to do work experience in their programmes in European companies. A magnificent opportunity to take part in different business cultures which, according to *The Erasmus Impact Study*, has a positive effect on job placement: more than one third of the scholarship holders remain in the company where they did their work experience. Moreover, Salesians Sarrià holds Erasmus accreditation in the area of Vocational and Professional Training and the prestigious 'ERASMUS CHARTER FOR HIGHER EDUCATION 2'.

Official Cambridge examinations

Salesians Sarrià is an authorised preparatory centre for the official Cambridge examinations, a training endorsement for students' academic future, particularly abroad, as well as for their future employment prospects.

Certified as a multilingual college

Our vocation to internationalise our educational community merited the recognition of the Fundació Escola Cristiana de Catalunya, which was acknowledged through the multilingual college certificate. This accreditation is a guarantee of the innovation, quality and monitoring of our international project.

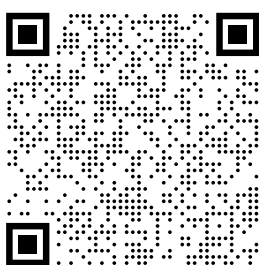

International projects

ERASMUS+ EUROPEAN PROJECTS

Once again this year, Salesians Sarrià took part in different activities that give the college a European-wide presence and recognition. Our students and staff have been able to grow thanks to their contact with other cultures, in terms of language and employment, not to mention in independence and confidence. Exchanges, company trade fairs, language assistants... Discover our entire international offer.



KA1: Work experience in European companies

The students from VET courses that participate in the Erasmus+ project undertake three months of work experience in European companies with a view to improving their professional and language skills. The students emphasise that this is a very enriching experience, since they learn how to deal with problems in a work setting in a foreign country. It is therefore a two-fold adaptation: to a new culture and to other working styles.



KA1: Job shadowing

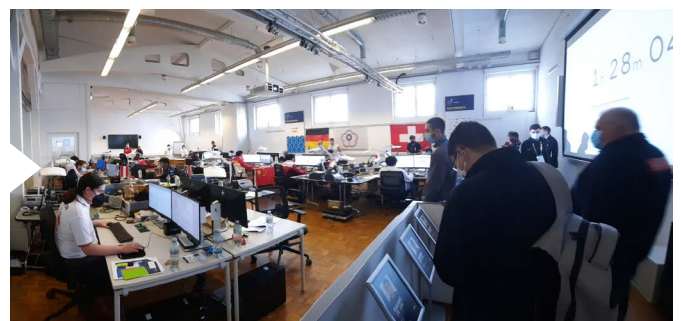
As part of the Erasmus+ project, Salesians Sarrià also participates in the 'Job shadowing' programme, through which a person symbolically becomes the shadow of a specialised worker in order to learn by observation how to do a specific job. This is a very practical way of learning different ways of teaching classes and working with students.

KA2: European e-Transport Network for VET

This international project has been designed for VET Motor Vehicle teachers and is intended to develop a European network around the electric vehicle, and to improve teachers' qualifications by sharing the latest knowledge from the sector, as well as new educational methodologies. In short, to bring this industry to VET and contribute to the European Union Green Deal. The programme length is three years.

We participate in WorldSkills

Manuel Alcalá, a former student of the Advanced level VET in Industrial Automation and Robotics, is making news again due to his participation in the WorldSkills world championship after winning the gold medal in the CatSkills and SpainSkills events. Manuel is a staunch defender of VET and his practical methodology has allowed him to participate in pre-eminent competitions.



Makathon contest

We entered the sixth edition of Makathon 2023, a technical project organised by the Dutch Nova College of Haarlem with which we have been working for years. Makathon is an event that brings together companies and institutions that present their challenges or needs to the students. The college has participated with VET students who were given the challenge of offering technical solutions to respond to needs regarding food wastage and cost reduction. These solutions ranged from the presentation of the idea to the development of a prototype.



From the MIT to Salesians

Our college took part in a top-level global educational project: The MISTI Global Teaching Labs, an initiative by the prestigious American university. Thus, over a three-week period in January and February we were treated to a stellar teacher: a student from the last year of MIT specialising in Computer & Data Science. The classes, which were given in English, provided first-hand knowledge of MIT's teaching methods, which focus on problem-solving. All the sessions were based on the hands-on methodology, a multisensorial approach that stimulates curiosity, experience, knowledge and retention.

Simulated Companies Trade Fair

One of the most outstanding international activities in the Administrative Management and Administration and Finance programmes is the Simulated Companies Trade Fair. This event is a meeting point where students and teachers share practices, work and experiences with schools and institutions that participate in the SEFED international network of the Fundació INFORM. The participants highlight how enriching the experiences and learnings they obtain through all the work involved in preparing for the trade fair were.



UNESCO Associated School

The UNESCO Associated Schools Network (in Catalonia it is called XEAUC) is a UNESCO programme aimed at promoting education for peace, intercultural dialogue and sustainable development through education. The schools undertake to promote these values through their communities and to work with other associated schools through exchanges of students, teachers and other educational personnel, and by organising activities to promote understanding and cooperation between cultures.

European Student Card

EDUCATIONAL OFFER

Salesians Sarrià specialises in post-compulsory education, and we teach the Intermediate level VET and training and placement programmes (PFI), Advanced level VET, Baccalaureate and International Baccalaureate. All these options are based on the Salesian educational model, where quality, caring for all people, and an international vision are our core values.

The objective of the Salesian educational model is to train competent professionals and upstanding individuals. To achieve this, we work on technical and professional skills, as well as the humanistic aspect, which is closely linked to the Salesian DNA.

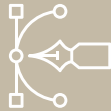

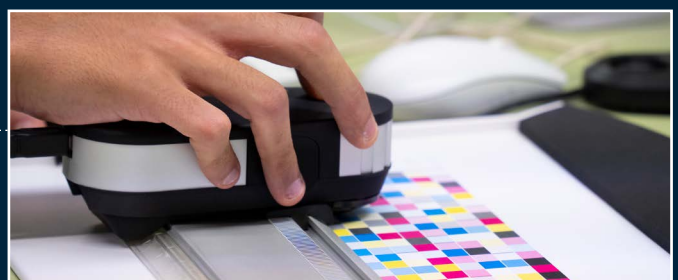

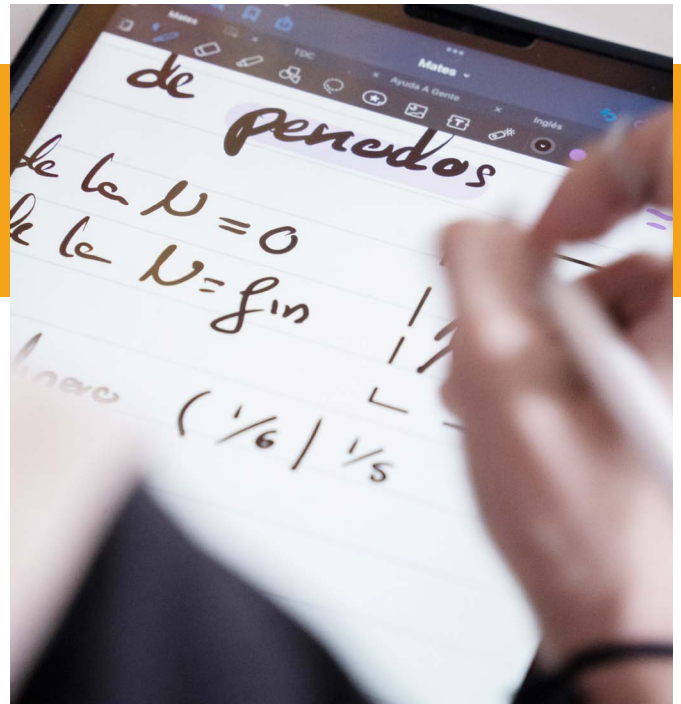

To be eligible for these courses, students must hold the Compulsory Secondary Education (ESO) completion certificate or its equivalent in foreign educational systems. Students who begin these courses at Salesians have to pass a selection process, an initial interview and also have suitable ESO academic records to meet the demands of these courses.

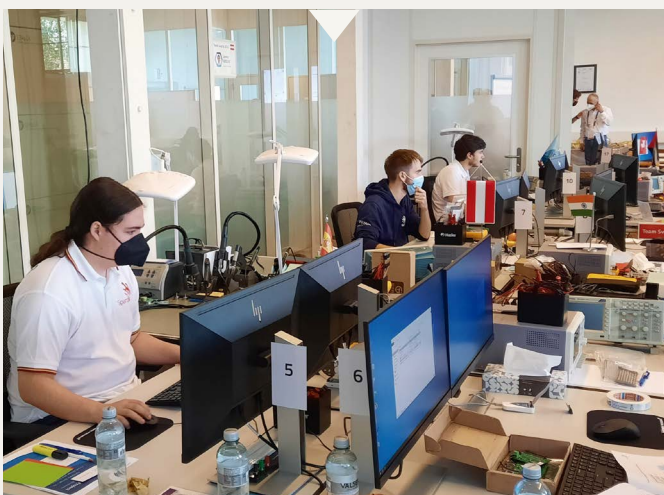
Educational innovation

The promotion of innovation and research among students reaps its rewards! Below, we share some examples of innovative projects that have received awards, as well as being experiences the students have worked hard to complete that have helped them strengthen these values.



Global WorldSkills VET

Manuel Alcalá, a former student of the Advanced level VET in Industrial Automation and Robotics, took part in the **WorldSkills** championship once again after carrying off the gold medal in the CatSkills and SpainSkills events. He also participated in EuroSkills, more specifically in the Electronics category, with an outstandingly high level in the tests performed and with participants from different countries, accompanied by teachers from the college. **'Once the competition is over, you realise that it is an experience you will never forget.** It is an impressive championship and the VET that I studied ensured I could experience it and compete with a real chance of success,' said Manuel.



Simulated Company Trade Fair

The students of the Intermediate VET in Administrative Management and the Advanced level VET in Administration and Finance participated in the **International Trade Fair on Simulated Companies** held during the week of the Education Fair at the Fira de Barcelona. The students, who became workers of the fictitious companies **Llibres i revistes EDB** and **Hotel Bosco Barcelona**, worked really hard to prepare, design and put up the stand, not to mention making contact with clients, suppliers, banking organisations and public institutions. Students and teachers got to share practices, work and experiences with schools and institutions that participate in the SEFED international network of the Fundació Inform.

Attendance at VET congresses

In the course of the academic year, we attended several institutional events for the promotion and improvement of VET. For example, we participated in the **10th anniversary of Dual VET** as one of the educational centres committed to this type of studies until 2022. We also attended the **2nd International VET Congress**, organised by PIMEC, the Catalan Employers' Organisation. Moreover, AMETIC, the Multisectorial Association of Companies of Electronics and Information and Communication Technologies, Telecommunications and Digital Content invited us to its talks with the aim of bringing together the country's different institutions leading the digital transformation.

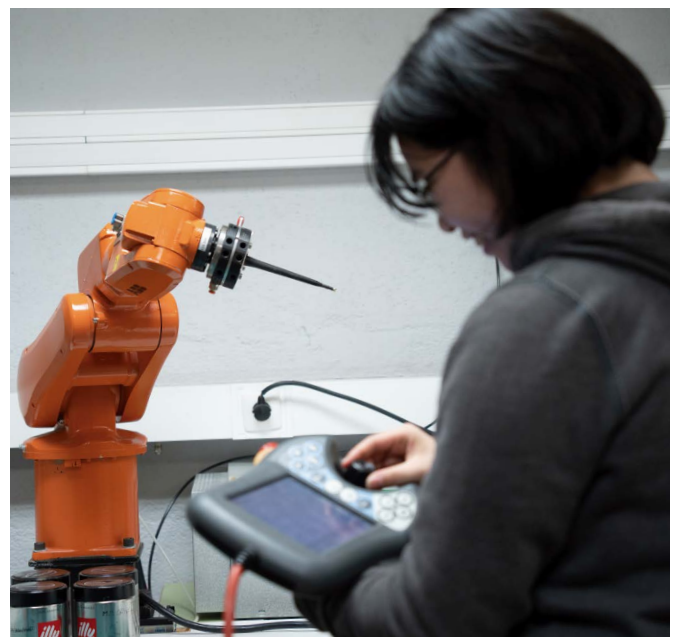

Salesians Sarrià's Employment Opportunities is a service we make available to our students and alumni with the goal of improving their chances of job placement.

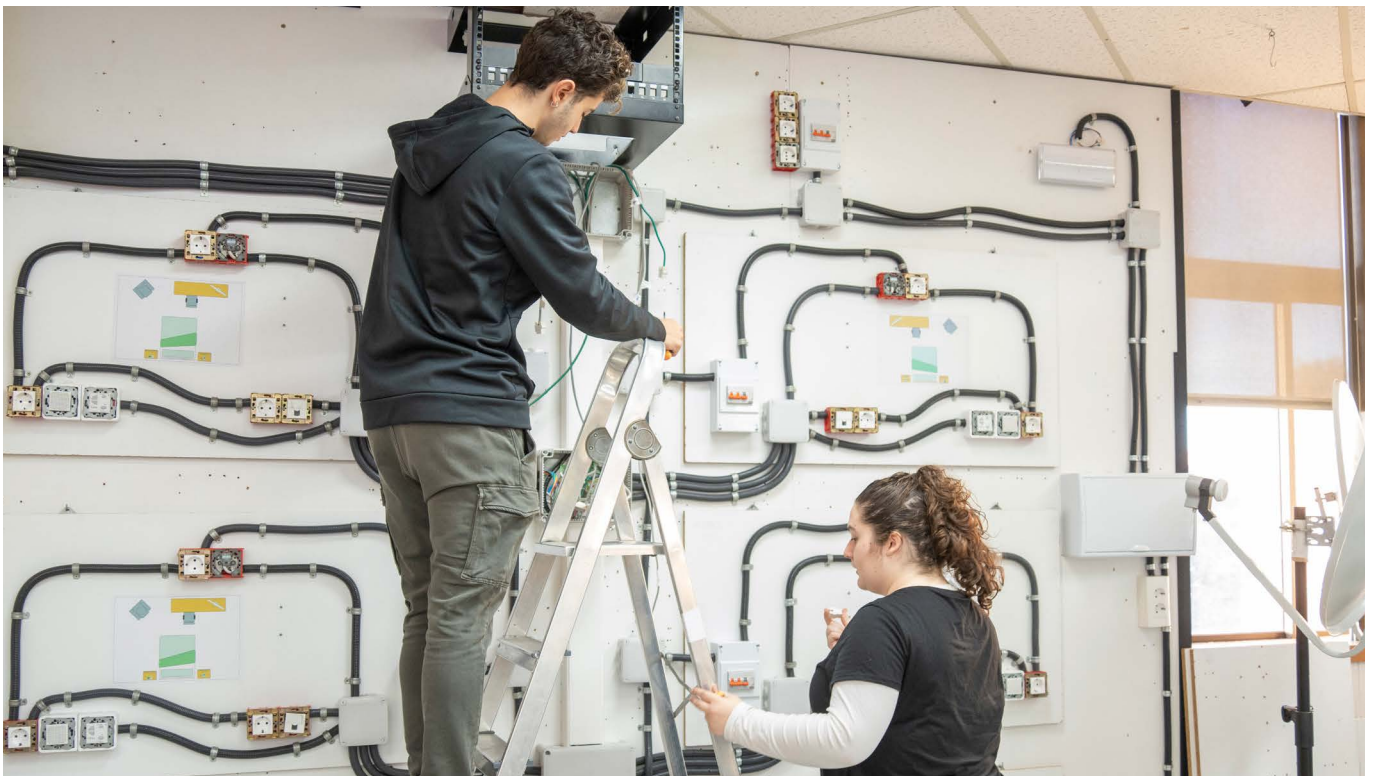

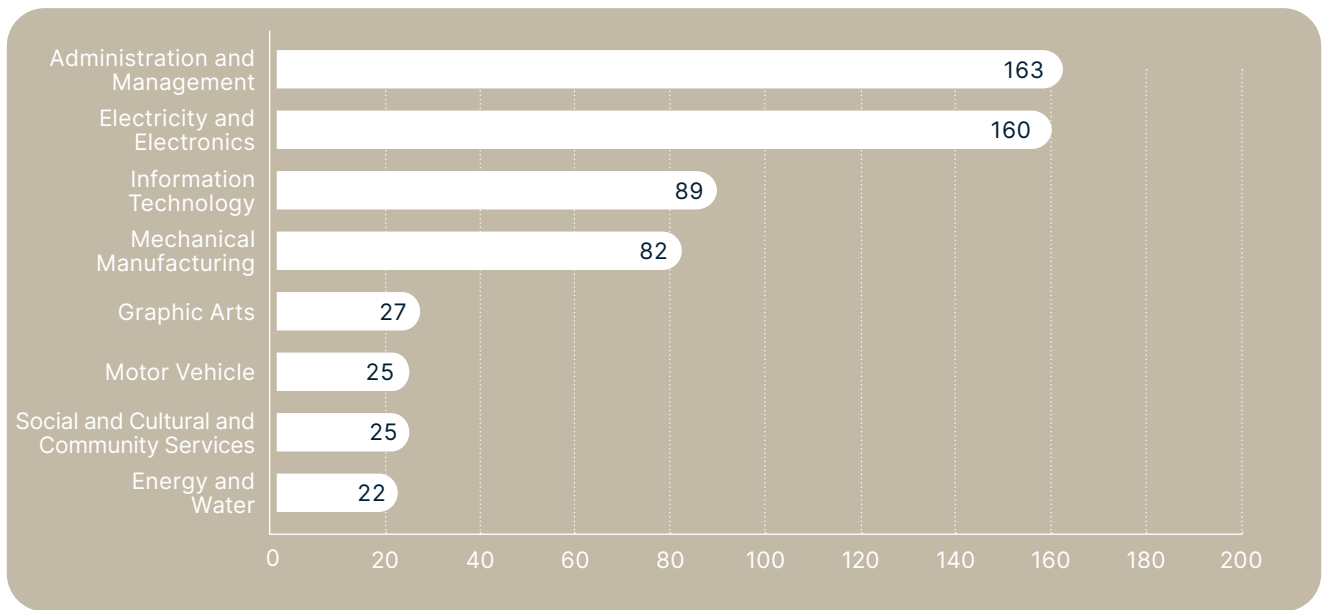
Any company can send us the job vacancies they need to cover. Salesians Sarrià screens the profiles that best match their requirements and sends the curriculum vitae to the

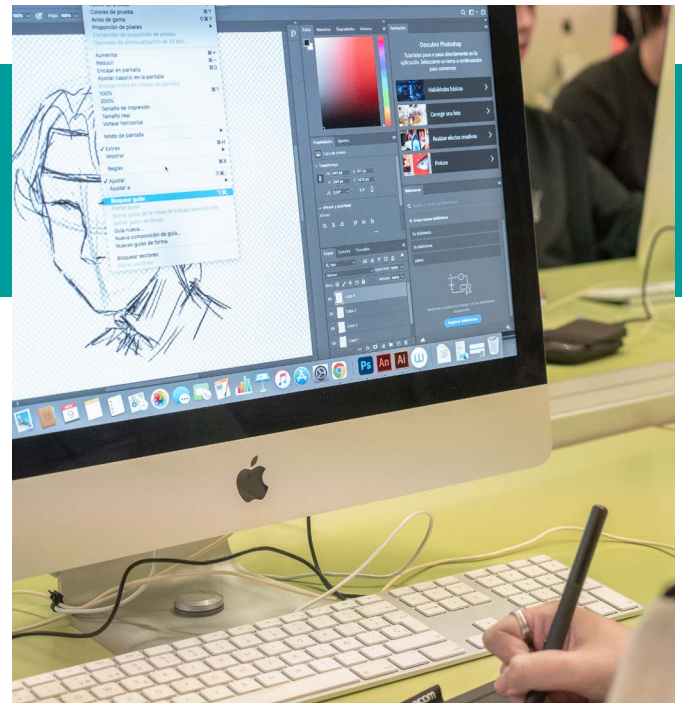

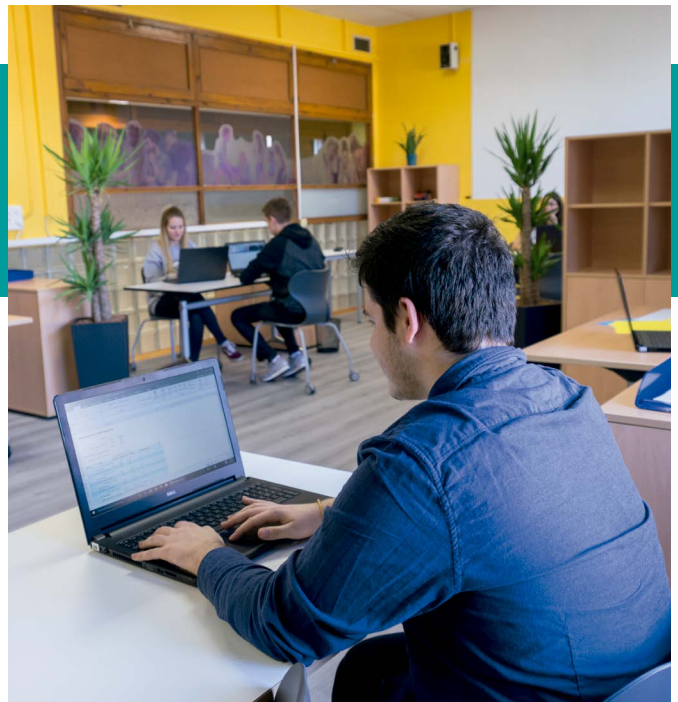

Co-working space

One of the college's objectives is to offer students entrepreneurial tools. Every year, an increasingly greater number of projects and experiences are implemented with this purpose in mind. This is why we are part of the Entrepreneurial Network of the Department of Education of Catalonia.

'We seek to foster entrepreneurship by supporting students and alumni through innovative projects that need a space where they can be brought to fruition'. These are the words of our director, Francisco Álamo, which summarise the spirit of this space very well. The idea is to provide continuity to the training imparted at the college and facilitate the development of the students' skills so that they can implement their projects.

The space has an office area (tables, chairs, cupboards, wi-fi, printer, etc.) and common areas. Moreover, we offer a guidance and information service that includes training capsules on issues related to entrepreneurship, a maintenance service and civil liability insurance. This space is available to alumni for a period of two years, until their project is solid enough to operate independently, and those who are part of the Alumni network can do so at very discounted prices.



Success stories

Promoting entrepreneurs yields its fruits: several innovative initiatives have been conceived at Salesians Sarrià. For example, **E-tupper**, a project by two alumni of the Advanced level VET in Industrial Automation and Robotics that consisted of designing lunch boxes that can heat up food with no need for microwaves. And **TheBlueDots**, an artificial intelligence project applied to agriculture which enjoyed exposure in media such as TV3.



Natàlia Palou is the new Coworking Space co-worker. She is an alumna of Salesians Sarrià, who is developing **Gaido**, an outsourced human resources service for up-and-coming companies and growing SMEs that will allow these companies to have a specialist in the management and development of their workforce. This lets them obtain a more economical and flexible service.

The college's head teacher, Xavier Brines, underscored the importance of the values of entrepreneurship, creativity and initiative of all young people who, like Natàlia, decide to embark upon an entrepreneurial project.

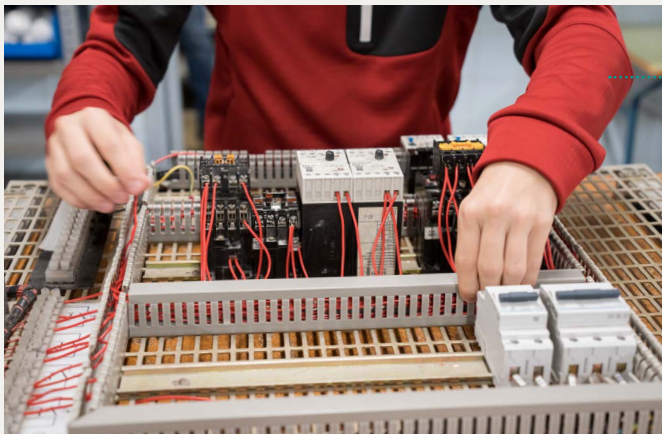


OUR SERVICES

Relations with companies

Double award at ARCAPACK

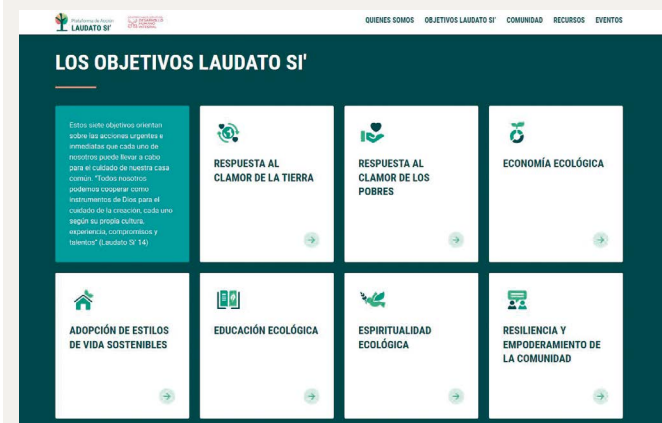

The second-year students of the **International Baccalaureate** explained their experiences in the CAS subject (Creativity, Activity and Service) to their first-year colleagues. A very enriching time for the first-year students who are enthusiastically starting out on this subject and have to design the activities that they would like to do.

Tutorial outings

The Baccalaureate and VET students have had several tutorial outings with their classmates in order to **strengthen the bond among the group beyond the school setting**. This ranges from recreational and outdoor sports activities to technical visits. Wonderful days to enjoy, share and get to know each other better.



Prize-winners at Eustory

Open House BCN

Our college participated in the **48h Open House BCN 2021** architecture festival which can be visited on 23 October, with volunteer students and teachers from the college as guides. **The Salesians Sarrià building has a unique architecture, not to mention a great deal of history:** it houses an air-raid shelter and was also a weapons factory during the Spanish Civil War.



Care of Dependent People (APD) activities

The Intermediate VET students of the Care of Dependent People were visited by two professionals from the **AIS Ayuda a la Infancia Sin Recursos** association to meet one of the groups that they study in the classroom. They also celebrated the Castanyada (chestnut roasting) and Halloween with people with functional diversity from the **Estimia home for the elderly**.





IB Talk

Students from the second year of the International Baccalaureate attended the chat on 'Integrity and Ethics in Research' given by Joana Porcel, head of research at **ISGlobal**. Academic integrity as the foundation of conduct in job creation (original audit and legitimacy) is one of the lines defended by the IB educational model.



NOVEMBER | 2021

7th VET Congress

Salesians Sarrià attended the **7th VET Congress**, held in Toledo on 4 and 5 November with the slogan 'VET, challenges for a world in transition'. Organised by **FP Empresa** and **CaixaBank Dualiza**, it delved into issues such as methodological innovation in the classroom and workshops, entrepreneurship, future outlook and the new VET law.



Visit by Marcelo Farfán

The Salesian **Marcelo Farfán** visited our college, on behalf of the Rector Major and as part of the visit programme of the **Maria Auxiliadora Salesian Inspectorate (SMX)**. Farfán brought a message of love and hope to the students: '**Don Bosco would invite us to do two things: to love and be loved, in order to be able to serve and transform the world.**'



Stress management

The **Educational Psychology Department** has designed training for college personnel that integrates tools and strategies to promote good emotional management of stress. **Sergi de Diego**, the former director of Childhood and Youth Mental Health Services of the **Fundació Vidal i Barraquer**, was in charge of the training.

Railway outing

The students of the Intermediate VET in **Electrical and Automated Installations** visited the workshops of the Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat de Catalunya (FGC) in Rubí. During the visit, **the students got to see how the railway operates** and how it is maintained. Moreover, a debate was held about civic-mindedness on public transport.



Dubbing workshop

The students from the **Arts Baccalaureate** who are taking the **Audiovisual Culture** subject did a **workshop on film dubbing** to learn about the techniques used in this profession. Another outstanding activity for the audiovisual students was a virtual visit to the studios of Televisió de Catalunya (TV3).



Companies Virtual Trade Fair

Intermediate VET students of **Administrative Management** took part in the **Simulated Companies Virtual Trade Fair** organised by the Fundació Inform (SEFED), featuring the participation of over 80 companies, 13 of which are European colleges. All in all, more than 2900 video-conferences were held to manage buying and selling operations and process accounting.



CPR workshop

The students from the Intermediate VET in **Motor Vehicle, Telecommunications and Electricity** attended a **cardiopulmonary resuscitation workshop (CPR)** organised by the Fundació Corachan. They learned cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques for adults under the supervision of Marc Guitars, a biomedical engineer and CPR instructor.





Work experience at the EUSS

The Technology Baccalaureate students participated in the Material Resistance workshop organised by the **Salesian University School of Sarrià (EUSS)**, part of the **LaborEUSS** programme. This programme brings the world of engineering closer to students as a possible future academic option, as well as the everyday reality at university facilities.

The Mechanics and Motor Vehicle Department participated in the **Automotive Talent Show** held at the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya (race track). More than 70% of the students that took part were first-time donors, a very positive figure. We organise two campaigns during the academic year.

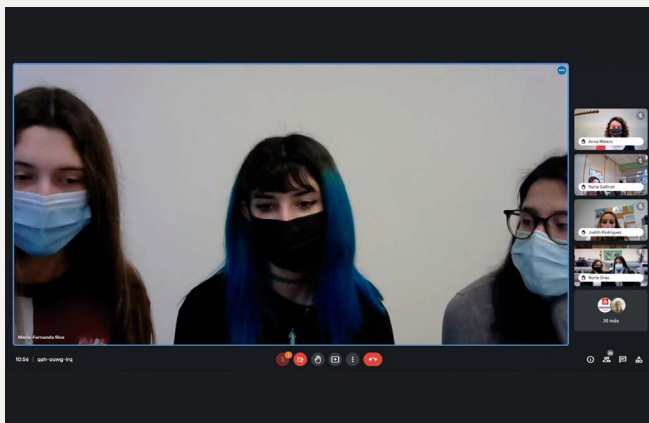
Solidarity talks

La Vanguardia also reported on the participation of teachers from our college in the 'Erasmus+ European e-Transport Network for VET' project, a meeting for VET Motor Vehicle teachers that seeks to promote electric mobility. The article also includes a picture of our electric vehicle workshop, while also underlining Salesians Sarrià's commitment to

sustainability and the quality of our VET programmes in Motor Vehicle and Electromechanics.

The same newspaper, which has one of the highest readerships in our country, interviewed our students Florian García, Sergi Rius and Oriol Beltrán to talk about their experience in international work experience as part of the Erasmus+ scholarships. Onward to International Relations, as the German local newspaper **Die Glocke** reported the exchange of students between our college and the German Fritz Winter school, and more specifically on the experience of young people from Germany in Barcelona.

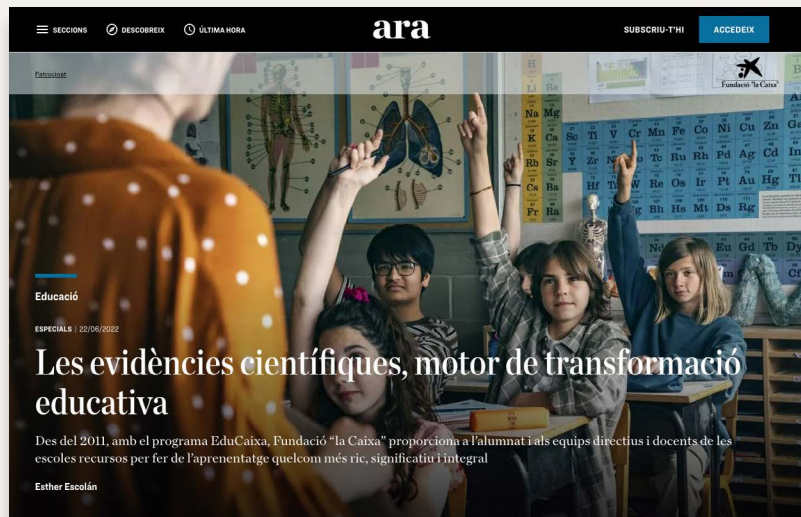

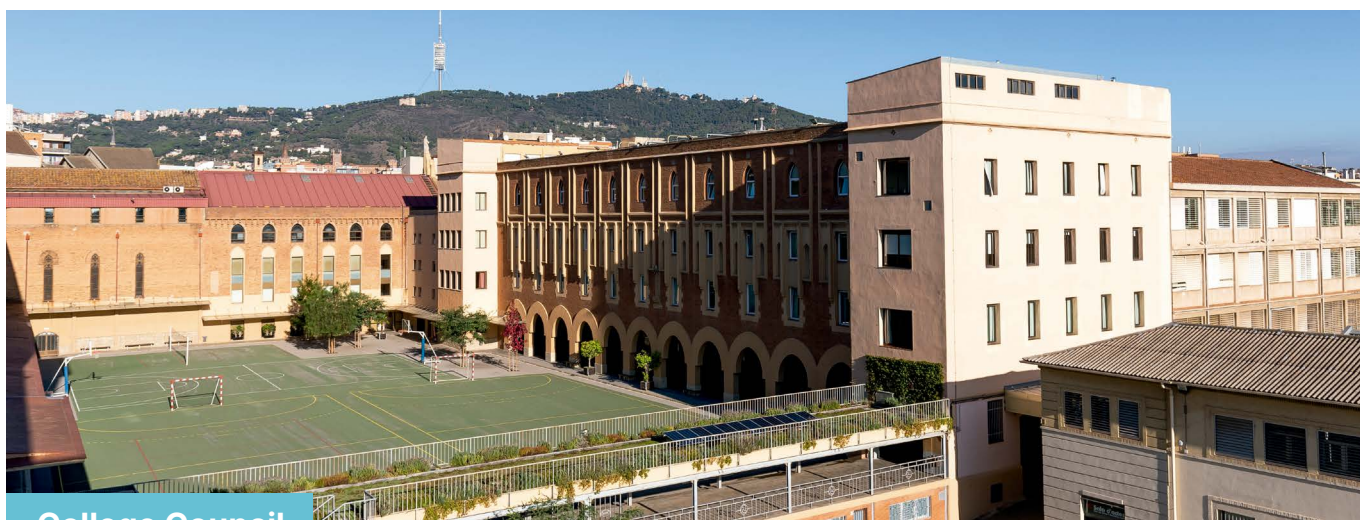

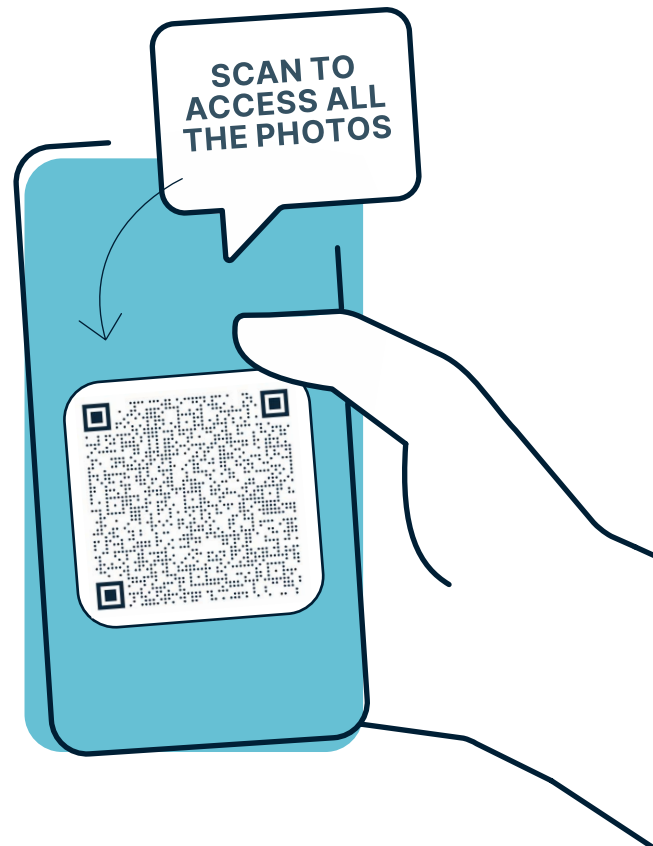
